Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Osborne Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the distinguished performance level to 50% on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade and End of Course assessments, and on the Gwinnett County Public Schools District Assessments by the year 2020.

- o **Annual Goal**

Ten percent of students within each performance level below distinguished on the Georgia Milestones English/language arts, math and science assessments and on the Gwinnett County Public Schools science and social studies District Assessments will score in the next highest achievement level.

- **Long Term Goal**

Osborne Middle School students will employ technology skills that encourage and increase collaboration, digital-age literacy, problem solving, and communication with an emphasis on integrating interdisciplinary and relevant learning experiences pervasively in all content areas by the year 2020.

- o **Annual Goal**

All certified staff will increase their instructional technology proficiency as defined by the Technology Integration Matrix.
