## Local School Plan for Improvement

### Phoenix High School

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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Phoenix High School will increase the academic performance in Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

- o **Annual Goal**

Phoenix High School will increase academic performance in the four core academic areas for all students. A 2% increase in the number of students that pass the EOC and a 2% increase in the number of students in the proficient area of the four core areas is the goal and expectation.

- **Long Term Goal**

Phoenix High School will demonstrate measurable gains in student achievement through reflective and collaborative teaching to ensure that all students graduate on time with opportunities to continue postsecondary education and/or enter the work force.

- o **Annual Goal**

Phoenix High School will increase the graduation rate including all summer school graduates by 2% on the CCRPI indicator.

- o **Annual Goal**

Phoenix High School will successfully open a satellite location at Sugarloaf Mills Mall in partnership with the Simon Youth Foundation. This satellite will focus on the population of students unable to maintain transportation to the main campus location. This satellite will focus on college and career readiness post secondary school. The goal is to open the campus with 40 students and to increase to 100 by May of 2019.
