Local School Plan for Improvement

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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. • Long Term Goal

Archer High School students will acquire the knowledge and skills to be successful as they continue their education at the postsecondary level and/or enter the workforce.

o Annual Goal

End of course test goal:

The percent passing for Archer students in each EOC course will rank among the top six schools in the district. The percent exceeds will be higher than the district mean exceeds values for each EOC course.

o Annual Goal

Advanced Placement goal:

The participation and performance of Archer students on Advanced Placement exams will exceed the results from 2015. Data points will include school-wide percent passing, percent of test-takers from the on-roll population, percent of students in the <30% and <50% expectancy range who score a 3 or higher, and percent of students in the >60% expectancy range who score 4 or higher.

o Annual Goal

Gateway goal:

The percent of <exceeds> scores in 2016 will be greater than the district <exceeds> percentage. The percent of Archer students eligible for free and reduced lunch scoring in the <meets> and the <exceeds> ranges will be greater than the 2015 values at Archer.

o Annual Goal

Graduation goal:

The 2016 graduation rate for Archer students will increase to 88%. The percent of on time college and career ready students for each grade level in May 2016, as defined by 3 of the 4 indicators on the district weighted school assessment, will be higher than the May 2015 values.
