Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in the Parent Involvement Policy and School/Parent Compact.

- **Long Term Goal**

Grace Snell Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “proficient” or “distinguished” performance levels on the Georgia Milestones & District Assessments for English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies to 75% by 2019-20.

- o **Annual Goal**

In Language Arts, Grace Snell Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the End of Grade assessment to; 50% for 6th Grade, 50% for 7th Grade, and 55% for 8th Grade. In addition, the percentage of students performing at the Distinguished performance level will be 15% or higher. 100% of Gifted students will score in the Distinguished performance levels.

- o **Annual Goal**

In Mathematics, Grace Snell Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the End of Grade assessment to; 50% for 6th Grade, 55% for 7th Grade, and 55% for 8th Grade. In addition, the percentage of students performing at the Distinguished performance level will increase to 15% or higher. 100% of Gifted students will score in the Distinguished performance levels.

- o **Annual Goal**

In Science, Grace Snell Middle School will increase the percentage of 8th Grade students scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the High School Physical Science End of Course assessment to 55%. In addition, the percentage of students performing at the Distinguished performance level will increase to 15% or higher. 100% of Gifted students will score in the Distinguished performance levels.

- o **Annual Goal**

In Social Studies, Grace Snell Middle School will increase the percentage of 8th Grade students scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the Social Studies GMAS End of Grade assessment to 55%. In addition, the percentage of students performing at the Distinguished performance level will increase to 20% or higher. 100% of Gifted students will score in the Distinguished performance levels.

- o **Annual Goal**

Grace Snell Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies District Assessment to 50%. The percentage of students performing at the Distinguished performance level will increase to 15% or higher. 100% of Gifted students will score in the Distinguished performance levels. In addition, 100% of students required to take an SPG will score 70% or higher on the final.
