Local School Plan for Improvement

Lanier High School

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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Lanier High School will increase its four year cohort graduation rate by 2% from its current school year. Our goal is to sustain and improve to the graduation rate for all students to complete the graduation requirements within 4 years.

- o **Annual Goal**

Lanier High School's graduation rate will increase by 3% from the 90.54% graduation rate from 2018.

- **Long Term Goal**

Lanier High School will increase achievement on College and Career Readiness Performance Index measures, Weighted School Assessment measures, and Advanced Placement participation and performance.

- o **Annual Goal**

Lanier High School will improve student performance in the four core academic areas along with improvements in EOCs, AP assessments, Gateway Assessment, PSAT, and SAT by 10% as indicated by the Georgia College and Career Ready Performance (CCRPI) Index and the Gwinnett County Weighted School Assessment (WSA).
