## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. #### • Long Term Goal

Creekland Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “Proficient Learners” or “Distinguished Learners” range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for English/Language Arts and Mathematics to 100% in 2020-2021.

##### o Annual Goal

Creekland Middle School Language Arts students will show mastery in language arts by increasing the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the district assessments to 75%. Additionally, Creekland Middle School will increase the percentage of students performing in the Proficient and Distinguished levels on the Milestones EOG to: 55% in 6th grade, 60% in 7th grade, and 65% in 8th grade.

##### o Annual Goal

Creekland Middle School students will show mastery in math by increasing the percentage of students scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the End of Grade assessment in 6th grade to 65%, in 7th grade to 65%, and in 8th grade to 25%. Eighth grade will increase the percentage of students scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished categories on the End of Course Algebra assessment to 80%. Additionally, the percentage of students scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished categories on the interim and post tests will to 50%.

##### o Annual Goal

Teachers will show an increase in the effective use of technology as measured by the eCLASS matrix.

#### • Long Term Goal

Creekland Middle School students will demonstrate mastery in mathematics with 100% of students scoring in the "Proficient Learners" or "Distinguished Learners" range on the coordinate algebra state assessment in 2018-2019 and mastery in physical science with 100% of students scoring in the "Proficient" or "Distinguished" range on the physical science state assessment in 2020-2021.

#### • Long Term Goal

Creekland Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “Proficient Learners” or “Distinguished Learners” range on the district assessments for English/Language Arts, Science, Social Studies and Mathematics to 100% by the 2020-2021 school year.

##### o Annual Goal

Creekland Middle School students will show mastery in social studies by increasing the percentage of students scoring in the proficient and distinguished range on the district assessments by 10%. Additionally, eighth grade will increase the percentage of students scoring in the proficient and distinguished range on the EOG Milestones Assessment by 10%.



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#### o Annual Goal

Creekland Middle School students will show mastery in science by increasing the percentage scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on the Physical Science EOC assessment to 55%. Students will also show mastery by increasing the percentage of students scoring in the proficient and distinguished levels on the district assessments.

6th grade Creekland students will increase in the percentage scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on district assessments to 65%.

7th grade Creekland students will increase in the percentage scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on district assessments to 80%.

8th grade Creekland students will increase in the percentage scoring in the Proficient and Distinguished performance levels on district assessments to 50%.
