## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. #### • Long Term Goal

By the 2019-2020 school year, 100% of students at Roberts Elementary will demonstrate proficient and/or distinguished ranges in math on the GMAS subtest. A minimum of 70% of students will score in the Distinguished Learners range. Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in the college and career of their choice.

#### o Annual Goal

Roberts Elementary grades 1-5 will increase the percentage of students in proficient and distinguished levels by 10% or reach 100 % on the District (DA)/SPG End of Year Assessments in Mathematics in each grade level :

Grade 1 will move from 87% to 97%.

Grade 2 will move from 97% to 100%

Grade 3 will move from 84% to 94%

Grade 4 will move from 82% to 92%.

Grade 5 will move from 91% to 100%.

#### • Long Term Goal

By the 2019-2020 school year, 100% of students at Roberts Elementary will demonstrate proficient and/or distinguished ranges in reading comprehension and writing on the GMAS subtest. A minimum of 70% of students will score in the Distinguished Learners range. Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in the college and career of their choice.

#### o Annual Goal

Roberts Elementary grades 1-5 will increase the percentage of students in proficient and distinguished levels by 10% on the District (DA)/SPG End of Year Assessments in Language Arts:

Grade 1 will move from 69% to 79%.

Grade 2 will move from 84% to 94%

Grade 3 will move from 73% to 83%

Grade 4 will move from 69% to 79%.

Grade 5 will move from 73% to 83%.
