## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. #### • Long Term Goal

Creekland Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “Proficient Learners” or “Distinguished Learners” range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for English/language arts and mathematics to 100% in 2020-2021.

##### o Annual Goal

Creekland Middle School students will demonstrate mastery in math with students scoring in the proficient or distinguished levels on the GA Milestones as follows:

6th: 52% to 54%; 7th: 52% to 57%; 8th: 18% to 60%

Creekland Middle School students will demonstrate mastery on the second semester District Assessment finals by moving more students into the proficient and distinguished levels.

6th standard: 25% to 52.3%; 6th ACC: 86% to 88%

7th Standard: 21% to 55%; 7th ACC: 63% to 69%

8th Intro: 18% to 57.2%, Algebra: 25% to 57.2%, ACC Algebra: 84% to 87%

#### • Long Term Goal

Creekland Middle School students will demonstrate mastery in mathematics with 100% of students scoring in the "Proficient Learners" or "Distinguished Learners" range on the Coordinate Algebra State Assessment in 2018-2019 and mastery in physical science with 100% of students scoring in the "Proficient" or "Distinguished" range on the Physical Science State Assessment in 2020-2021.

#### • Long Term Goal

Creekland Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “Proficient Learners” or “Distinguished Learners” range on the district assessments for English/language arts, science, social studies and mathematics to 100% by the 2020-2021 school year.

##### o Annual Goal

Creekland Middle school students will demonstrate mastery on the GA Milestones in language arts scoring in the proficient and distinguished performance levels as follows:

6th: 53% to 59%; 7th: 58% to 64%; 8th: 61% to 69%

Creekland Middle School students will demonstrate mastery on second semester District Assessment finals by moving more students into the proficient and distinguished levels.

6th: 66% to 70%; 7th: 61% to 64%; 8th: 67% to 70%

##### o Annual Goal

Creekland Middle School students will demonstrate mastery in physical science with 65% of students scoring in the proficient and distinguished levels of the Science Georgia Milestones.

Creekland Middle school students will demonstrate mastery on the first-semester district assessment in science scoring in the proficient and distinguished performance levels as follows:

6th Earth Science 65%; 7th Life Science 50%; 8th Physical Science 42%



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**o Annual Goal**

Creekland Middle School students will demonstrate mastery in the proficient and distinguished levels at minimum 65% achievement on the Social Studies Georgia Milestones for grade 8.

During the 18-19 school year, CMS students will score a minimum of 5 percentage points higher in the proficient and distinguished levels on the second semester final district assessments.

6th grade 59%; 7th grade 61%; 8th grade 65%

**o Annual Goal**

Creekland Middle school students will demonstrate mastery in their respective Beyond the Core classes with a passing score of 70 or better.
