What are the qualifications to register to vote?

You must be...

- A U.S. Citizen
- A legal resident of Georgia and Gwinnett County
- 17 ½ years old to register
- 18 years old to vote

Where can I register to vote?

- Offices where driver's licenses or ID cards are issued
- Offices where persons apply for public assistance or which administer programs for the disabled
- Voter Registrations and Elections Office
- All Gwinnett County public schools and the ISC
- All public libraries
- All city halls

- The free [GA Votes](#) app allows for registration and updates or changes to name and/or address information. The site also provides information on polling locations, sample ballots, satellite voting locations, push notifications, and more!

Where do I go to vote?

You can find your polling place for the upcoming election by visiting the [My Voter Page](#) on the Georgia Secretary of State's website (www.mvp.sos.ga.gov). This site can tell you your registration status, poll location, advanced voting locations, elected officials, as well as provide a sample ballot. If you live in a city that is holding municipal elections on November 3, you may have to vote in different locations for the E-SPLOST referendum and in your city election.

What is the deadline to register to vote for the 2015 E-SPLOST?

The deadline to register to vote for the November 3 election is October 5. If you are already registered and have had a change of name or address, *within the county*, it must be changed by October 5, as well.

How do I request an absentee/mail-in ballot?

Any registered voter who is eligible to vote in an election may request an absentee ballot. Application forms to request an absentee ballot are available online at:

1. Complete and print the application for the absentee ballot, returning it in one of the following ways:
 - Fax the application to (678) 226-7209
 - Scan and email the application to absentee@gwinnettcountry.com
 - Deliver the application to the Elections Office at 455 Grayson Highway, Suite 200, Lawrenceville
 - Mail the application to Gwinnett County Voter Registrations and Elections Division, 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, GA 30046
2. Absentee ballots will be mailed to those making a request beginning October 12. They must be returned in person or through the US Postal Service no later than October 31. Absentee ballots cannot be faxed or submitted through any other method.

Important Dates for the November 3, 2015 Election

- Oct. 5** **Last day to register to vote** in Gwinnett County, or to update your name or address on the voter rolls if either has changed since you registered to vote.
- Oct. 12** **Absentee and Early Voting begins.** Vote **in person** through Oct. 31 at the Elections Office, at 455 Grayson Hwy., Suite 200, Lawrenceville, GA 30046. Hours are Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Completed **absentee ballots** may be mailed to the Gwinnett County Voter Registration and Elections Division, 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, GA 30046, or may be delivered by the voter to the Grayson Highway Elections Office. For more information, call (678) 226-7210.
- Nov. 3** **Election Day.** Polls are open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.
