## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Our goal at Chesney Elementary is to increase the percentage of third, fourth, and fifth grade students performing in the Proficient (50%) and Distinguished (50%) ranges on the GA Milestones Language Arts Assessment to 100% by 2020-2021.

- o **Annual Goal**

The percent of Chesney students in grades K-5 performing at or above 70% on the Post 2 Language Arts District Assessment will be at least 100% and the percent of students scoring in the proficient and distinguished ranges collectively will increase by 20 percentage points.

- **Long Term Goal**

Our goal at Chesney Elementary is to increase the percentage of third, fourth, and fifth grade students performing in the Proficient (50%) and Distinguished (50%) ranges on the GA Milestones Mathematics Assessment to 100% by 2020-2021.

- o **Annual Goal**

The percent of Chesney students in grades K-5 performing at or above 70% on the Post 2 Mathematics District Assessment will be at least 100% and the percent of students scoring in the proficient and distinguished ranges collectively will increase by 10 percentage points.

- **Long Term Goal**

Our goal at Chesney Elementary is to increase the percentage of fifth grade students performing in the Proficient (50%) and Distinguished (50%) ranges on the GA Milestones Science Assessment to 100% by 2018-2019.

- o **Annual Goal**

The percent of Chesney students in grades 3-5 performing at or above 70% on the District Science Assessment will be at least 100% and the percent of students scoring in the proficient and distinguished ranges collectively will increase by 25 percentage points.

- **Long Term Goal**

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in the Parent Involvement Policy and School/Parent Compact.
