2012 - 2017	Technology improvements system wide to support teaching and learning: Includes retrofitting all schools over the next five years to update classroom technology (including, but not limited to, teacher laptops, student research stations, network printers, projectors, screens, and wireless notebook carts); school labs and media center technology; technology to support administrators and counselors; upgrades to school and district video broadcast technology (digital cameras, video cameras, audio recording devices, and audio/video editing equipment and software) and network upgrades to include wireless switches and access points to accommodate students bringing their own technology. System technology upgrades will include the implementation of eCLASS, upgrades to PeopleSoft, enhanced access for students, teachers and parents to data and digital content, and advanced analytical capabilities.		
	System wide facility modifications, renovations, modernizations, energy conservation upgrades, and infrastructure improvements: air-conditioning of all HS and MS gyms, ES activity buildings, and kitchens; buses (new/refurbished); ADA improvements; new Fleet Maintenance facility; athletic facility upgrades to standards; furniture/fixtures/equipment growth and replacement; fine arts growth and replacement; basic equipment list upgrades; facility improvements district wide such as new roofs, floor coverings, interior finishes, windows and glazing, repainting, new and more efficient HVAC and lighting systems
