By the end of the 16-17 school year, students at Harris Elementary will demonstrate growth in mathematics as measured by an increase in the percentage of students in Grades 1-5 scoring in the proficient and distinguished categories of the District Assessments (DA) / SPG Post -Tests in mathematics. By the end of the 16-17 school year, students at Harris Elementary will demonstrate growth in science as measured by an increase in the percentage of students in Grades 1-5 scoring in the proficient and distinguished categories of the District Assessments (DA) / SPG Post -Tests in science.
