GCPS keeps eye on equity as it heads back to school

As the 2020-21 school year begins, Gwinnett County Public Schools continues its work and commitment to educational equity in the school district. In particular this work will focus on six areas that support the Board of Education's Equity Policy. Those areas are: Educational Opportunities and Expectations, Teaching and Learning, Student Support, Community Engagement and Partnerships, Facilities and Assets, and Human Resources, Leadership and Staff. For each area, a team will meet for a nine-week period, identifying current procedures and proposing improvements to support educational equity. The teams will analyze and improve the structures, systems, and support needed to promote educational equity throughout the district.

Dr. Tommy Welch, the district's Chief Equity
Officer, will update the members of the Gwinnett
County Board of Education on the work of these teams.
At the August School Board meeting, Dr. Welch will
share the list of team members taking part in this
review. Following that initial report, the Board will
learn more as information becomes available about the
improvements developed in procedures, accountability
measures, and the findings of both internal and external

Gwinnett's Educational Equity Policy:

The Gwinnett County Board of Education is committed to educating all students and to providing the resources needed to support high-quality teaching and learning. The district's focus on increasing student achievement, access and opportunities through the implementation of equitable and inclusive educational and workplace policies and practices reduces barriers and builds the district's capacity to deliver innovative, effective, and culturally relevant services.

The Board of Education authorizes the CEO/Superintendent and his or her designee to design or redesign systemic programs and initiatives to address and reduce educational inequity, providing students and staff with targeted supports and enrichment that increase opportunities to succeed.
