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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Discovery High School will increase its 4-year cohort graduation rate to 85% by 2019-2020.

- o **Annual Goal**

Discovery High School will pursue 100% CCRPI Content Mastery on all Georgia Milestones End of Course assessments with an annual increase of at least 5% for all students.

- o **Annual Goal**

Discovery High School will increase its 4-year cohort graduation rate to 85% by 2019-2020.

- **Long Term Goal**

By 2019-2020, at least 87% of all first time Gateway test takers will receive a score of "Meets" or "Exceeds" in Science and Social Studies.

- o **Annual Goal**

While working toward 100% student proficiency, the percentage of Discovery High School first time test takers will increase to at least 87% on the 2019-2020 Gateway Social Studies and Science assessments.

- **Long Term Goal**

Discovery High School will build parent capacity to support student achievement by implementing the activities outlined in the Parent Involvement Policy and School/Parent Compact.
