## Local School Plan for Improvement

### Parkview High School

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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Parkview High School will improve the four year cohort graduation rate for all students.

- o **Annual Goal**

Parkview High School will increase the cohort graduation rate by 2% for the 2018-19 school year.

- **Long Term Goal**

Parkview High School will increase academic performance for all students in the areas of Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Performance will be measured by local (Gateway), state (EOC), and national assessments (SAT, ACT, AP).

- o **Annual Goal**

Parkview High School will increase academic performance in the core subject areas for ALL students to meet and / or exceed district and state averages as measured by the Georgia End of Course Milestone Assessments while striving for a 2 point gain on the College and Career Readiness Performance Index measure.

- o **Annual Goal**

Parkview High School will increase the percent of students scoring in the meets and exceeds categories on the district Gateway Assessment in both Science and Social Studies. Science scores will increase from 87% (17-18) to 91% and Social Studies will increase from 89% (17-18) to 91%. In addition, the % of students scoring in the Exceeds category will increase 2% on both assessments.
