Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Moore Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “proficient” or “distinguished” range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for mathematics, English/ language arts, science and social studies to 100% in 2019-2020.
