Local School Plan for Improvement

Mountain View High School

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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Establish a K-12 standard for rigor resulting in increased participation in and successful completion of accelerated courses. Mountain View High School will increase the number of students attempting the AP exam to 700, the number of test taken to 1200 and the percentage of students scoring 3,4 or 5 to 75% by the 2019-2020 school year.

- **Annual Goal**

Through Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual Enrollment opportunities, Mountain View High School will increase college credit opportunities for our students. Mountain View High School will increase the percentage of students scoring 3+ on AP exams to 75% for the 2018-2019 school year, the number of students attempting AP exams to 750, and the number of exams taken to 1250 in 2018-2019. MVHS will sustain the total number of dual enrollment students to at least 200 and the college credits earned through dual enrollment for the 2018-2019 school year to 14 credits on average.

- **Long Term Goal**

Mountain View High School students will be successful according to all indicators of the CCRPI. Mountain View's CCRPI score will improve to 90 and our graduation rate will improve to 95 by the 2019-2020 school year.

- **Annual Goal**

Mountain View High School will increase its 4-year graduation rate to 93% in 2018-2019.

- **Annual Goal**

Mountain View High School will increase its CCRPI to 88% in 2018-2019.

- **Long Term Goal**

Mountain View High School will improve student achievement across the curriculum for students in all subgroups specifically economically disadvantaged in Math and Language Arts on the Georgia Milestones Assessment by the 2019-2020 school year.

- **Annual Goal**

Mountain View High School will improve student achievement and literacy for all students to meet and/or exceed baseline targets on the district Gateway writing assessment and the Georgia Milestone Assessment. Specifically for Gateway, the percentage of Meets category by decreasing the percentage of Does Not Meet category from 21% Does Not Meet in science to 15% or less and the percentage from 15% Does Not Meet in social studies to 10% or less. MVHS will increase its percentage of distinguished and proficient learners by 5% in all EOC content areas.
