Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Trickum Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “proficient” or “distinguished” performance levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies to 100% by spring 2019.

- **Annual Goal**

Trickum Middle School students will achieve an average of 80% or higher on each local common summative assessments in Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies in 2017-2018.

- **Long Term Goal**

Trickum Middle School will increase the percentage of students meeting typical or high growth as measured in the Progress section of the College and Career Readiness Performance Index to 100% by spring 2019.

- **Annual Goal**

In order to rank in the top 7 among GCPS Middle Schools in each content area, the percent of Trickum Middle School students will increase by at least 5% in the levels of proficiency on the GCPS District Assessments in Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies than the previous school year.
