Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

K-5 students at Rock Springs Elementary School will demonstrate proficiency in reading comprehension and writing. 100% of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will score in the Proficient and/or Distinguished range and at least 50% will score in the Distinguished range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System in English Language Arts. Individual students will meet or exceed their expected levels of performance/growth on the GMAS ELA subtest.

- o **Annual Goal**

The percentage of Rock Springs Elementary School students scoring in the meets and exceeds categories on the English and Language Arts 2015 - 2016 District Assessment (DA) posttest will increase by 5 - 10 percentage points when compared to the 2014-15 English and Language Arts DA posttest scores in the meets and exceeds categories.

- **Long Term Goal**

K-5 students at Rock Springs Elementary School will demonstrate proficiency in mathematical concepts. 100% of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will score in the Proficient and/or Distinguished range and at least 50% will score in the Distinguished range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System in Mathematics. Individual students will meet or exceed their expected levels of performance/growth on the GMAS Math subtest.

- o **Annual Goal**

The percentage of Rock Springs Elementary School students scoring in the meets and exceeds categories on the 2015 - 2016 Mathematics District Assessment (DA) posttest will increase by 5 - 10 percentage points when compared to the 2014-15 Mathematics DA posttest scores in the meets and exceeds categories.
