Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Mill Creek High School will increase the 4-year cohort graduation rate to 95% by the end of the 2020-2021 school year; and the 5-year extended graduation rate to 96%.

- o **Annual Goal**

Mill Creek High School will increase the 4-year cohort graduation rate to 93% by the end of the 2017-2018 school year and the 5-year extended graduation rate to 94%. Mill Creek will also reduce the number of off track students in each graduating class through interventions, academic support, and teacher training on best practices.

- **Long Term Goal**

Mill Creek High School will increase student achievement for ALL students in the areas of LA, Math, Science, and Social Studies as measured by the CCRPI.

- o **Annual Goal**

Mill Creek High School will increase academic performance in the core academic subjects for all students in regards to meeting and exceeding the annual targets as measured by CCRPI. The objective will be to increase the overall CCRPI rating for 2017 - 2018 to an overall score of 94.0, which would be an increase of 1.6 points from the 2016-2017 CCRPI score of 92.4.
