



2016 - 2017 Local School Plan for Improvement Shiloh High School

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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Shiloh High School will increase its graduation rate to 84% in 2019-2020.

- o **Annual Goal**

Shiloh High School will increase the cohort graduation rate from 67% in 2015-2016 to 77% in 2016-2017.

- **Long Term Goal**

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in the Parent Involvement Policy and School/Parent Compact.

- **Long Term Goal**

Shiloh High School's passing rate for first time testers on the Gateway Social Studies and Science will increase to 90% or higher by 2019-2020.

- o **Annual Goal**

Shiloh High School's first time Gateway testers will increase the passing rate from 64% to 70% in Science and 81% to 86% in Social Studies.

- **Long Term Goal**

Shiloh High School will increase the pass rate annually for all End of Course assessments by 5% or higher, as well as all other local, state, national and international exams for each student

- o **Annual Goal**

Shiloh High School's student performance on the district assessments and/or SPGs will meet or exceed the district average for the 2016 – 2017 school year in all tested subjects.
