## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

The percentage of students, including those in the targeted subgroups (SWD and ESOL), scoring in the "meets" and "exceeds" categories on the Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science county interim assessments and the state standards on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase to 100% scoring "on track" or above (with at least 30-40% scoring in the "commendable" level) by SY2017.

- o **Annual Goal**

All students will score at or above the Gwinnett County average and meet or exceed the county average growth (from semester pretest to posttest) on the language arts, science, and social studies district assessments during the 2015-2016 school year.

- **Long Term Goal**

The percentage of students, including those in the targeted subgroups (SWD and ESOL), scoring in the "meets" and "exceeds" categories on the Math county interim assessments and the state standards on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase to 100% "on track" or above (with at least 30-40% scoring in the "commendable" level) by SY2017.

- o **Annual Goal**

All students will score at or above the Gwinnett County average and meet or exceed the county average growth (from semester pretest to posttest) on the math district developed assessment during the 2015-2016 school year.

- **Long Term Goal**

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in the Parent Involvement Policy and School/Parent Compact.
