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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Patrick Elementary School will increase academic performance in literacy, performing in the top 20% of schools on RBES WSA by spring 2022

- o **Annual Goal**

85% or more of all students in grades 3-5 will score on or above grade level on the Georgia Milestones Assessment in Reading. 85% or more of all students in grades K-2 Reading will score on or above grade level as measured by the Benchmark Assessment System.

- o **Annual Goal**

70% or more of all students in grades 3-5 will score in the Proficient or Distinguished performance levels in ELA on the Georgia Milestones Assessment. 70% or more of all students in grades K-2 will score in the Proficient or Distinguished performance levels in ELA on the GCPS District Assessments.

- **Long Term Goal**

Patrick Elementary School will increase academic performance in numeracy, performing in the top 20% of schools on RBES WSA by spring 2022

- o **Annual Goal**

80% or more of all students in grades 3-5 will score in the Proficient or Distinguished performance levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for Mathematics. 80% or more of all students in grades K-2 will score in the Proficient or Distinguished performance levels on the GCPS District Assessments.
