Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. Long Term Goal

Partee Elementary students will extend their abilities to read fluently and confidently, communicate successfully in oral, written, and electronic forms, and value reading and listening as a means of learning in all content areas. Students will use research skills effectively to gather and present information. Our faculty and staff will work collaboratively to ensure 100% of our students will meet or exceed state expectations by the 2019-20 school year.

o Annual Goal

16-17 READING: Excellence in Literacy

Partee Elementary School will increase student achievement scores for students in grades 3,4, and 5 on the Spring, 2017 GA Milestones English-Language Arts content assessment at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels. Improvement will be measured by students in 3rd grade will increase scores by a minimum of 15 percentage points; 4th grade will increase scores by a minimum of 10 percentage points; and 5th grade will increase scores by a minimum of 15 percentage points. As measured in comparison to prior year district assessment data, students' post assessment scores in grades 1 - 5 will increase by 15% on the English-Language Arts SPG/District Post Assessments.

Long Term Goal

Partee Elementary School students will become confident and knowledgeable problem-solvers in all areas of mathematics and science. Our faculty and staff collaborate to ensure all students possess a conceptual understanding of numbers and operations, the ability to compute, think critically, and communicate their mathematical and scientific thoughts effectively. One hundred percent of our students will meet or exceed state expectations by the 2019-20 school year.

o Annual Goal

16-17 MATHEMATICS

Partee Elementary School will increase student achievement scores for students in grades 3,4, and 5 on the Spring, 2017 GA Milestones Mathematics content assessment at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels. Improvement will be measured by students in 3rd grade will increase scores by a minimum of 10 percentage points; 4th grade will increase scores by a minimum of 10 percentage points; and 5th grade will increase scores by a minimum of 12 percentage points. As measured in comparison to prior year district assessment data, students' post assessment scores in grades 1 - 5 will increase by 12% on the Mathematics SPG/DA Post Assessments.

Long Term Goal

Partee Elementary School students will be respectful, responsible, and cooperative students in a safe, orderly, and caring environment where excellence in behavior is valued. through the implementation of our schoolwide discipline plan, our student discipline data will reflect a decrease of a minimum of 2 percentage points each year.
