Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Our goal at Chesney Elementary is to increase the percentage of third, fourth, and fifth grade students performing in the Proficient (50%) and Distinguished (50%) ranges on the GA Milestones Language Arts Assessment to 100% by 2020-2021.

- o **Annual Goal**

Chesney Elementary School will increase the percentage of students achieving at the proficient and/or distinguished levels on the Language Arts District Assessment by 33 % (with an increase of 10% in distinguished level) over the 2017-2018 school year in grades first through fifth.

- **Long Term Goal**

Our goal at Chesney Elementary is to increase the percentage of third, fourth, and fifth grade students performing in the Proficient (50%) and Distinguished (50%) ranges on the GA Milestones Mathematics Assessment to 100% by 2020-2021.

- o **Annual Goal**

Chesney Elementary School will increase the percentage of students achieving at the proficient and/or distinguished levels on the Math District Assessment by 14 % (with an increase of 10% in distinguished level) over the 2017-2018 school year in grades first through fifth. Kindergarten will score at or above the district average on the Math District Assessment.

- **Long Term Goal**

Our goal at Chesney Elementary is to increase the percentage of fifth grade students performing in the Proficient (50%) and Distinguished (50%) ranges on the GA Milestones Science Assessment to 100% by 2020-2021.

- o **Annual Goal**

Chesney Elementary School will increase the percentage of students achieving at the proficient and/or distinguished levels on the Science District Assessment by 33 % (with an increase of 10% in distinguished level) over the 2017-2018 school year in grades first through fifth.

- **Long Term Goal**

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in the Parent Involvement Policy and School/Parent Compact.
