Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. #### • Long Term Goal

Balanced Literacy--Reading/Writing: Louise Radloff Middle School's students' scores on the Georgia Milestones Assessments in English/Language Arts (grades 6, 7, and 8), Math (grades 6, 7, and 8), Science (grade 8), and Social Studies (grade 8) so that 75% or more of students will be performing at or above grade level (in the Proficient Learner and Distinguished Learner categories) by 2019-20.

#### o Annual Goal

Literacy--Reading/Writing: Louise Radloff Middle School's students' scores on GA Milestones Assessments (in all subjects tested) and on GCPS District Assessment year-end Posttests (for all grades and all subjects) will increase by at least 25% in the Proficient and at least 25% in the Distinguished Learner categories for an overall on-grade level improvement in achievement. #### • Long Term Goal

Balanced Numeracy: Louise Radloff Middle School's students' scores on the Georgia Milestones Assessments in Math (grades 6, 7, and 8) and Science (grade 8) will increase so that 75% or more of students will be performing at or above grade level (in the Proficient Learner and Distinguished Learner categories) by 2019-20.

#### o Annual Goal

Numeracy: Louise Radloff Middle School's students' scores on the GA Milestones Assessments (in all grades and levels of MA and SC tested) and on GCPS District Assessment year-end Posttests (for all grades and all MA- and SC-based subjects) will increase by at least 25% in the Proficient and at least 25% in the Distinguished Learner categories for an overall on-grade level improvement in achievement.
