# Local School Plan for Improvement GIVE Center West High School

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. ## Long Term Goal

GIVE Center West will increase the percentage of students who score at the proficient and/or distinguished level on Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies Georgia Milestones assessments and district assessments to 100% in 2019-2020.

#### o Annual Goal

GIVE Center West will increase the percentage of students who score at the proficient and/or distinguished level on Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies Georgia Milestones assessments and district assessments to 50% in 2017-18.

## Long Term Goal

In order to increase GIVE West students' cohort graduation rate, high school students will earn an average of 2.5 credits per semester in 2015-2016, 2.6 credits in 2016-2017; and 2.7 credits in 2017-2018.

#### o Annual Goal

In order to increase GIVE West students' cohort graduation rate, high school students will earn an average of 2.7 credits per semester in 2017-2018.

#### Long Term Goal

Decrease the percentage of students who return to a disciplinary panel from 11.5% in 2014-2015 to 10.5% in 2015-2016; 10% in 2016-2017; and 9.5% in 2017-2018.

#### o Annual Goal

Decrease the percentage of students who return to a disciplinary panel from 10.1% in 2016-2017 to 9.5% in 2017-2018.
