White Oak Elementary School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the proficient or distinguished learner range on the Georgia Milestones assessment for English/Language Arts to 100% by the 2021-2022 school year.

#### o Annual Goal

White Oak Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade teams will increase the grade level percent proficient/distinguished on the Language Arts District Assessment Post Tests. For the 2018-2019 school year, the grade level increase targets are outlined on the attached data sheet.

## o Annual Goal

The percentage of students in the proficient and distinguished category on the Georgia Milestones will increase in the area of language arts for 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade. For the 2018-2019 school year, the grade level increase targets are outlined on the attached data sheet.

## Long Term Goal

White Oak Elementary School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the proficient or distinguished learner range on the Georgia Milestones assessment for Mathematics to 100% by the 2021-2022 school year.
