## What are the qualifications to register to vote in Gwinnett County?

You must be...

- A U.S. Citizen
- A legal resident of Georgia and Gwinnett County
- 17½ years old to register
- 18 years old or older to vote

## The deadline to register to vote for the Nov. 3 election is Oct. 5.

### Where can I register to vote?

- Offices where driver's licenses or ID cards are issued
- Offices where persons apply for public assistance or which administer programs for the disabled
- Voter Registrations and Elections Office
- All Gwinnett County public schools and the Instructional Support Center
- All public libraries
- All city halls
- Online at: [www.mvp.sos.ga.gov](http://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov)
- The free GA Votes app allows for registration and updates or changes to name and/or address information. The site also provides information on polling locations, sample ballots, satellite voting locations, push notifications, and more!

### Where do I go to vote?

You can find your polling place for the upcoming election by visiting the My Voter Page on the Georgia Secretary of State's website ([www.mvp.sos.ga.gov](http://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov)). On this site, find your registration status, poll location, advanced voting locations, elected officials, and a sample ballot. If you live in a city that is holding municipal elections on Nov. 3, you may have to vote in different locations in the E-SPLOST referendum and in your city election.

### How do I request a ballot to vote absentee/advance by mail?

Any registered voter who is eligible to vote in an election may request an absentee ballot. Application forms to request an absentee ballot are available online at: <http://bit.ly/GwinCoRequestAbsenteeBallot> OR apply online at <http://www.securevotega.com/secureabsentee/>

Print, complete, and sign the application for the absentee ballot, returning it in one of the following ways:

1. Fax the signed application to 678-226-7208 or 678-226-7275.
2. Scan and email the signed application to [absentee@gwinnettcountry.com](mailto:absentee@gwinnettcountry.com).
3. Deliver or mail the signed application to the Elections Office at 455 Grayson Highway, Suite 200, in Lawrenceville.

The last day for the Voter Registrations and Elections Office to accept completed absentee applications is 5 p.m. on the Friday before the election. However, the Voter Registrations and Elections Office does not recommend trying to vote by mail the week prior to the election. Ballots cannot be guaranteed for delivery. Instead, request a ballot as soon as possible if you plan to vote absentee/advance by mail.

Absentee ballots may be returned by mail or by in-person delivery to the Elections Office or by delivery to a secure ballot drop box. Drop boxes are under 24-hour surveillance and are located throughout the county, available 24/7 until Election Day at 7 p.m. No postage is required if using a drop box. ## Important Dates for the November 3, 2020 Election

**Oct. 5 Last day to register to vote** in Gwinnett County, or to update your name or address on the voter rolls if either has changed since you registered to vote.

**Oct. 12 Advance in-person voting begins.** Eligible voters may vote advance in-person every day, including weekends, from **Oct. 12–30** at the following locations:

- **Elections Office** (455 Grayson Hwy., Suite 200, in Lawrenceville), **8 a.m.–5 p.m.**
- **8 additional satellite locations, 7 a.m.–7 p.m.**  
(Bogan Park Community Recreation Center, Lenora Park Gym, Dacula Park Activity Building, Lucky Shoals Park Community Recreation Center, George Pierce Park Community Recreation Center, Gwinnett County Fairgrounds, Mountain Park Activity Building, Shorty Howell Park Recreation Center)

The last day to vote in person is the Friday before the election (Oct. 30). There is no advance voting on the Saturday, Sunday or Monday immediately prior to the election. <http://bit.ly/GwinCoAdvanceVoting>

**Mid-Oct.** If you want to vote by mail, it is recommended that you request your ballot by mid-Oct. to allow time for mailing.

**Nov. 3 Election Day.** Polls are open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.
